

MID MOD DECANTER SET

MATERIALS

734	Jewelled Decanter	CB604 # 4 Soft Fan
736	Jewelled Cup	RB110 10/0 Detail Liner
8010	Art Tape	DOTG01 Dotting Gyre (optional)
9599	Hydra Art Sponge	Assorted Cobalt Brushes

GLAZES

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Wipe down the decanter and cup with a dry Hydra Art Sponge.
2. Use the Art Tape to mask the area just under the top facets and the area above the bottom facets on the decanter. On the cup, mask the area just above the bottom facets.
3. Mix Plum Yum with Snow Queen to create a light purple shade. Water this down to a skim milk consistency.
4. Use the fan brush to apply 2 coats of the wash to the top and bottom parts of the decanter, and on the top part of the cup.
5. When the glaze is no longer "shiny", carefully remove the masking tape.
6. Use Plum Yum, Pea Soup, Olive Branch, Tangerine, Coral, Golden Rose Bonbon, Red Peony and assorted round brushes and detail liners to fill in each panel of the center facets with abstract lines, brushstrokes, and geometric and organic shapes. Paint 1-2 coats for each pattern and shape.
7. Repeat step 6 to fill all the center facets of the decanter, and do the same on the bottom facets of the cup.
8. Once the colorful patterns have dried, use a Detail Liner brush and Black Swan to add dashes, funky shapes and line designs on top of the colorful designs.
9. Optional: Use the Dotting Gyre to create dots on top of the colored patterns using Black Swan. Do this on both the decanter and cup.
10. Use the Detail Liner brush to apply 2 coats of Lion's Roar on the borders above and below the center facets of the decanter, and above the bottom facets of the cup.
11. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

Optional: Add Gold on top of the Lion's Roar lines. Use a small brush to add 1 even coat of Gold over the already clear glazed and fired decanter and cup. Stilt and fire again at cone 018. Enjoy!
