INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Dust off the bowls with a dry Hydra Art Sponge.
- 2. Using a Fan Brush, paint 2 coats Cashew Later on the pedestals of the bowls. While still wet, use the round brush with Crackerjack Brown to add darker streaks to the pedestals.
- 3. To simulate two scoops of ice cream, take a #2 Pencil and lightly sketch a wavy line to divide the area above the "cone" painted in step two.
- **4.** On the big sundae bowl, use the Fan Brush to apply 3 coats of Pink-A-Dot above the pencil line. On the small sundae bowl, use the Fan Brush to apply 3 coats of Agu-ward above the pencil line.
- 5. Using a Script Liner Brush or Round Brush, add Hot Tamale spots to the pink as "chunks of strawberries". Repeat this step using Brown Cow on the smaller bowl over the Aqu-ward glaze, as "chocolate chunks".
- **6.** Use a Script Liner with Crackerjack Brown to add cross hatching on the pedestals of both bowls to give it a waffle cone effect.
- 7. Use Old Lace to add wavy lines to the unpainted area below the Pink-a-Dot (large bowl) and Agu-ward (small bowl) for a scoop of vanilla ice cream. Paint a few Old Lace drips on

- the waffle cone pedestals. Repeat this step on both bowls.
- **8.** Paint 2-3 coats of Java Bean to the inside of both sundae bowls. Paint a few drips over the rim to create the look of hot fudge.
- **9.** When the Java Bean glaze inside the bowls is dry, use a Round Brush to paint 2 coats of Old Lace in the center to simulate whipped cream.
- 10. Mix Old Lace with Cashew Later and use a Script Liner brush to add some swirly ripples in the whipped cream.
- **11.** With an assortment of rainbow colored glazes, use a Script Liner brush to add sprinkles all over the "hot fudge" in both bowls. Apply 1-2 coats for sprinkles over dry hot fudge.
- 12. Paint a Hot Tamale circle on top of the whipped cream area on both bowls to create cherries.
- 13. Using a Script Liner Brush with Java Bean, paint the indent at the top of the cherries and a stem and add Old Lace highlights to the cherries. Let the bowls dry completely.
- **14.** Clear Glaze, and Fire to Cone 06. Enjoy!
