

CREEPIN' IT REAL LANTERN

MATERIALS

2121	Large Jack-O-Lantern
9599	Hydra Art Sponge
C500-Fan4	Cobalt Fan Brush #4
C500-R6	Cobalt Round Brush #6
RB110	10/0 Detail Liner
DOTG01	Dotting Gyre
#2 Pencil	

GLAZES

SC040	Blueberry Hill
SC075	Orange-A-Peel
SC005	Tiger Tail
SC048	Camel Back
SC015	Tuxedo
SC016	Cotton Tail



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Dust off the Jack-O-Lantern with a dry sponge.
2. Dip one side of the fan brush in Camel Back and the other side in Blueberry Hill. Paint into all the creases and crevices of the pumpkin. Be sure not to mix the colors too much so both show through and are not muddled together.
3. Dampen the sponge and wipe the glaze off of the surface of the pumpkin, leaving it only in the creases and crevices.
4. Pour a quarter sized amount of Orange-A-Peel and Tiger Tail on your palette. Mix these 2 colors together, then water down to a skim milk consistency.
5. Use the fan brush to paint 2-3 coats of this wash over the entire pumpkin. Let the wash dry completely.
6. Take a pencil and lightly sketch a spider web around the lid of the pumpkin. Tip: Use the crevices as your guide lines for the straight lines of the web.
7. Lightly sketch a scalloped design around the eyes.
8. Lightly sketch a spider hanging down from the web in between the Jack-O-Lantern's eyes and nose.
9. Lightly sketch a bat shape around the mouth.
10. Lightly sketch out any other spooky embellishments like blood drips, stitches, bones, etc.
11. Paint in sketched details (spider web, spider, bat, and designs) with 2-3 coats of Tuxedo using the detail liner and round brushes.
12. Use the dotting gyre to add different sized Tuxedo dots to outline or fill in areas that you choose. Let all of the Tuxedo glaze dry.
13. Fill in the inner edges of the eyes, nose, and mouth with 2-3 coats of Tuxedo.
14. Paint 2-3 coats of Tuxedo on the stem.
15. Using the detail liner and dotting gyre add Cotton Tail accents and dots to all of the black designs. Be sure to add at least 2 coats of Cotton Tail.
16. Paint a Cotton Tail hourglass shape on the spider's abdomen using 2-3 coats of Cotton Tail.
17. Add any Tuxedo or Cotton Tail accents as needed.
18. Use the leftover Orange-A-Peel, Tiger Tail, Blueberry Hill, Camel Back, and Cotton Tail to add wood grain like accents on the stem. Let everything dry.
19. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06. Enjoy!
