

FAMILY FAVORITES SERVING BOWL

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Wipe down the bowl with a clean Hydra Art Sponge.
2. Gently peel away an assortment of Fern Stickers, Double Leaf Stickers, and Laurel Stickers from each sticker page.
3. Adhere each sticker around the inner rim of the bowl, creating a leafy wreath design. Ensure each sticker is securely flat on the bisque surface.
4. Begin an ombre technique inside the bowl using Rawhide and Blue Dawn. To create a blended look across the bowl surface, first paint the center of the bowl with a thick layer of Rawhide. Second, quickly paint the inner rim area of the bowl with a thick layer of Blue Dawn.
5. Once both colors are applied, dip a large brush into water and use this wet brush to “blend” the colors together where they meet.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 until 2-3 coats of color have been applied to the bowl. Allow your project to dry completely until the bowl no longer has a shine.
7. Time to silkscreen! Follow the steps listed below using Tuxedo and Silkscreen Medium to apply the “Family” silkscreen design to the bowl center:
 - a. Squirt a quarter-sized amount of Tuxedo onto a flat palette.
 - b. Sprinkle a pinch of Silkscreen Medium over the glaze, then use a toothpick or paintbrush handle to mix the glaze and medium. The Silkscreen Medium will thicken the glaze as you mix. Aim for a creamy, peanut butter-like consistency.
 - c. Position the silkscreen design in the center of the bowl and hold it securely in place.
 - d. Scoop up some of the thickened glaze mixture onto your finger, then press and rub the mixture through the silkscreen design. Start applying color at the center, then move outwards in a circular motion.
 - e. Hold the silkscreen in place on one side and gently lift the other side to see if the design has successfully transferred. If you missed a spot, lay it back down and apply additional color.
 - f. Remove the silkscreen to reveal the transferred design.
 - g. Immediately rinse off your silkscreen using cold water and lay it flat to dry.
 - h. Tip: Do not let the glaze dry on your silkscreens, as this could damage the screen over time.
8. Allow the silkscreen design to completely dry. If needed, use a liner or detail brush to touch up the design outline with 1 coat of Tuxedo.
9. Use a pin to gently remove each sticker from the bisque surface, leaving you with an assortment of unpainted leaf designs.
10. Alternate using 2-3 coats of Jaded and Lettuce Alone to fill in the leaf designs. Let dry.
11. Use a liner or script brush to loosely outline each leaf design with 1-2 coats of Tuxedo.
12. Sponge Blue Dawn along the rim of the bowl using a Hydra Art Sponge.
13. Dip your choice of Sponge Dotter into Blue Dawn, then sponge on half circles along the bottom rim of the bowl's outside surface. This will create a scalloped design. Repeat again to achieve 2 coats of color.
14. Allow the project to dry completely, then clear glaze and fire to cone 06.
