INSTRUCTIONS

1. Start by cutting out your template and transfer paper to the same size. Make sure your transfer paper is facing dark side down before you start cutting.
2. Place the transfer paper and template down on the side of your planter and hold it in place. Trace the bird of paradise flower design with a pencil.
3. Next paint the top 4 petals on top of the flower with 2 coats of Cant-Elope. While the glaze is still wet add a few brush strokes of Candy Apple Red on the petals. You can use both your detail liner brush and script liner brush to paint in the petals.
4. Paint the other top petals with 2 coats of The Blues. While those petals are still wet add a few brush strokes of Purple Haze and Candy Apple Red.
5. Then paint the base of the flower with 2 coats of Sour Apple. Then go ahead and blend some brush strokes of Candy Apple Red, Cant-Elope, The Blues, Purple Haze, and Green Thumb on the flower's base.
6. Next add some Candy Apple Red and Purple Haze on the flowers base right above where the stem connects.
7. Then paint 2-3 coats of Sour Apple and Green Thumb on the stem and leaves. Let all of the glaze dry completely.
8. While your glaze is drying, take Honeydew list and water it down with your fan brush.
9. When the glaze on your planter has totally dried, you can add a quick wash of the watered down Honeydew List glaze over the entire outside of the planter. 1-2 coats will be enough. Go ahead and paint a light wash over your flower design as well.
10. Then with your detail liner brush outline the flower, leaves, and stem with Tuxedo. Add any detail lines to the petals and leaves too. (Refer to the template if needed).
11. Next take the Tree Frog Crystal Glaze and shake it up and stir well to disperse the crystals evenly throughout the glaze. Then with your fan brush paint 2-3 coats of Tree Frog on the rim and inside your planter.
12. Finally with your Script Liner Brush create a few Tree Frog drips marks on the outside rim of the planter. Be sure to add tiny drip marks above your Bird of Paradise Design so the crystal glaze doesn't cover it up.
13. No Clear Glaze is required! Woohoo! Everyone is going to rave over this Tropical Paradise Planter!
