## INSTRUCTIONS

- Dust off the tray with a dry sponge.
- Use masking tape to secure the Dear Santa Silkscreen to the tray.
- Pour a quarter size puddle of black glaze on the flat surface of the palette.
- Add a pinch (about half the size of a dime) of silkscreen medium into the black glaze and stir thoroughly with a popsicle stick to a creamy peanut butter consistency. Silkscreen medium thickens more as it sits. If the mixture isn't the right consistency after about 1 minute, add a bit more silkscreen medium.
- Scoop some of the glaze/medium mixture with your finger and press and rub it over the screen to push the glaze mixture through the screen. Since this is a large screen, it will work best if you work in sections so that the glaze does not dry on the screen while you work. To do so, cover about ½ of the screen and then, while holding the screen in place on one side, lift the painted side up to "unstuck" it and then gently replace it back down. Continue screening another ½, then hold in place and lift again. Complete the final ½ of the screen. Before removing, hold in place on one side and lift to check that all details are screened well. If not, lower the screen back in place and go over any areas that didn't screen well. Let it dry.
- Squirt small amounts of all colors listed spaced out onto your palette. Water them down to a skim milk consistency.
- Use orange to tint in the carrots using the round brush.
- Mix some red and orange together to add a darker tinted edge to the carrots.
- Mix the dark green and teal together to create a dark green/blue. Tint in the base of the carrot stems with this color.
- Use dark green and lime green to fill in the rest of the carrot stems to create a gradient.
- For the holly leaves, tint one half of the leaves with the dark blue green mixture and the other half dark green.
- Add more water to ½ of the red to lighten it up. Start at one side of the holly berry with the lighter mixture and use the thicker, darker red to tint in the rest of the berry. Mix a tiny bit of the watered down red mixture with the dark green blue mixture to create a dark maroon color to add into the centers of the berries.
- Tint in the lettering with golden yellow.
- Using non-watered red glaze and a detail liner, create diagonal red lines going around the border of the tray.
- Use a dotting gyre to add any accents and dots to decorate your tray.
- Use a detail brush to add some white(not watered down) highlights to the berries and the carrots.
- Write a name under "Love," lightly with a pencil. Use the detail liner brush to trace over the name in your desired color. 1-2 coats is recommended.
- Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

**NOTE:** This project can be created on a wide range of flat trays, platters, and large plates we carry.

**Tip:** If you accidentally get glaze in an unwanted area of your tray while applying the silkscreen, let the glaze dry completely then lightly sand off the excess glaze using sandpaper.
