



MATERIALS

Froggy Fruitfly Trap
 Hydra Art Sponge
 Assorted Brushes

GLAZES

EL158 Pine Needles FN232 Sun Yellow
FN009 Black S2724 Lotus Blossom

FN020 Medium Green

INSTRUCTIONS

- **1.** Wipe down the frog with a dry Hydra Art Sponge.
- 2. Use a soft fan brush to paint 2 coats of Medium Green inside the frog body, under the lid, and on the bottom of the base.
- **3.** Paint 2-3 coats of Sun Yellow on the belly and eyes of the frog.
- **4.** Use a soft fan brush to paint 2 coats of Pine Needles on the outside of the frog's head and body. Allow time to dry.
- **5.** Paint 1 generous coat of Lotus Blossom over the Pine Needles.

TIP: Before painting, use a popsicle stick or the handle of a paintbrush to stir the glaze thoroughly, making sure to lift and mix in any settled crystals from the bottom of the container for an even distribution.

- **6.** Dip the spoke #7 on the Dotting Gyre into Black. Add a dot in each pupil of the eyes.
- 7. Make sure the entire inside and outside of the Frog Fruitfly Trap is fully covered with at least 2 coats of glaze to ensure it is completely sealed and water tight.
- **8.** No clear glaze required! Fire to cone 06. Enjoy!
