

SHELL OF A TIME DISH

MATERIALS

3129	Big Shell Dish	Assorted Brushes
9599	Hydra Art Sponge	Toothbrush

GLAZES

SC005	Tiger Tail	SC046	Rawhide
SC016	Cotton Tail	SC048	Camel Back
SC028	Blue Isle		

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Wipe down the dish with a clean Hydra Art Sponge.
2. Paint the shell dish with 1 thick coat of Camel Back.
3. Use a damp Hydra Art Sponge to wipe away the glaze color from the dish. This antiquing technique will wipe away most of the color from the surface but will leave Camel Back accents in the detailed crevices of the shell.
4. Begin an ombre technique on the dish using Rawhide, Tiger Tail, and Blue Isle. To create a blended look across the dish surface, first paint $\frac{1}{3}$ of the dish with a thick layer of Rawhide. Second, quickly paint the middle area of the dish with a thick layer of Tiger Tail. Thirdly, paint the remaining $\frac{1}{3}$ area with a thick coat of Blue Isle.
5. Once all 3 colors are applied, dip a large brush into water and use this wet brush to “blend” the colors together where they meet.
6. Repeat steps #4 and #5 until 3-4 coats of color have been applied to the dish.
7. Time for splatter painting! Dip a toothbrush into Cotton Tail. Angle your toothbrush over the dish and rub your thumb over the bristles to splatter the dish with speckles of paint.
8. Optional: Paint the underside of the dish using 3 coats of your desired color using a large brush or by sponging on 3 coats of paint using a Hydra Art Sponge.
9. Allow the project to dry completely, then clear glaze and fire to cone 06.
