3135 Lighted Zane's Haunted Hideaway

9599 Hydra Art Sponge

Assorted Brushes

GLAZES

SC005 Tiger Tail

SC034 Down to Earth

SC013 Grapel

SC039 Army Surplus

SC015 Tuxedo

SC041 Brown Cow

SC016 Cotton Tail

SC050 Orange Ya Happy

TIP: Ask for help BEFORE you try to fix a mistake. Most mistakes can be corrected if you ask before you try to fix them. Remember, we're here to help!

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Prepare the Piece:

- Clean the entire piece with a dry or lightly damp sponge (not dripping wet).

2. Base Coat and Antique the Piece:

- Using a soft fan brush, apply 1 coat of Down to Earth over the whole hat, making sure to get into all the nooks and crannies.
- With a clean, damp Hydra Art Sponge, gently wipe away the excess color, leaving brown in the crevices and light scuff marks on the surface to create an aged, weathered effect.

3. Apply a Purple Wash:

- On your palette, pour out a half-dollar-sized amount of Grapel and thin it with water to a skim milk consistency.
- Use a soft fan brush to apply 1–2 coats of the wash over the entire hat.
- Use a small round brush to carefully paint inside the star cutouts.

4. Paint the Hat Band and Window Frames:

- Mix a quarter-sized amount of Orange Ya Happy with a dime-sized amount of Down to Earth to create a burnt orange.
- Paint 2–3 coats of this color on:
 - The band around the hat
 - All window frames, including the window on the door

5. Paint the Door and Windows:

- Paint the door frame and window bump-out (at the top of the hat) with 2 coats of Brown Cow.
- Water down Army Surplus to skim milk consistency.
- Apply 2–3 coats to the door, shutters, and roof of the window bump-out.
- Use a detail liner brush to paint the hinges and door lock with 2 coats of Tiger Tail.



6. Paint the Stone Steps:

- Mix Tuxedo and Cotton Tail to make a dark gray color.
- Paint the steps in front of the door with this gray color.
- Add streaks of Army Surplus for a mossy effect.

7. Paint the Bats:

- Paint the embossed bats with 2 coats of Tuxedo.

8. Add Accents:

- Use Down to Earth and a detail liner brush to add wood grain accents to:
 - The door frame
 - The window bump-out
- Add Tuxedo accents to:
 - Window frames
 - Door hinges
 - Keyhole on the door lock
- Finally, paint Tuxedo spiderwebs hanging from the window corners, shutters, and door edges.
